Dunnville Thrift Store!

The Society of Saint Vincent de Paul St. Michael's Dunnville Conference has been operating a Thrift Store for over 33 years. Our humble roots began above the parish centre with just a handful of Vincentians and store volunteers. We have had a few moves over the years and at present are located in the downtown area of our town, close to our neighbours in need as well as our loyal customers.

A typical day will see our store volunteers sorting donations and putting them out for sale at very reasonable prices. All donations are accepted with a heart felt thank you – for without donations to our store our Conference would probably not exist. We carry gently used clothing, footwear, small household items, books, etc. Unfortunately, we do not have the space to offer furniture or other large items.

Our food voucher program helps those in need with their grocery expenses this is the main goal of our outreach program: feed the poor. We have a small food area (Vinnie's Cupboard) which share with those in need. This cupboard is filled by donations from elementary Michael's school; as well as customers and volunteers.

Our Twin in Dominica was hit hard by Hurricane Maria in 2017. We collected items to be sent to them via an associated

group in Hamilton (hygiene products, batteries, baby items, etc.). Monetary donations were also collected and forwarded on. These poor souls have been living a distressed existence since the natural disaster and any help we give them

is appreciated.

At times we run special events or raffles to help raise funds. We did a raffle for a quilt which was made entirely from donated clothing and the work of a few of our people. Pictured selling tickets at Food Basics is (L-R) Jasmine Moody, Secretary; and Mary Mater, President and Store Manager.

Our thrift store is run

Strathroy Economy Shop

Strathroy-Caradoc is a municipality located 40KM west of London.

All Saints Catholic Church established a SSVP Conference in 1967. In 1971, five Vincentians lead by Hugh Thompson recognized an opportunity for the Society to extend their outreach in the community and initiated the establishment of the SSVP Economy Shop, opening in 1972. At this time, the Conference was deactivated as a 'Traditional Conference' and the Economy Shop became the 'face' of the Society in Strathroy. They leased a property that previously was a lumber yard. Over the years, the property experienced five ex-



pansions, inclusive of a new warehouse built in 2000.

We work with in the following organizations in our community:

- The Women's Rural Resource Center (providing clothing vouchers)
- Leads Employment Agency helping people re-enter the work force, and referring clients to the Economy Shop to obtain clothing to assist in job searches (e.g. steel toe boots)
- Social Justice Committee of All Saints Parish (providing vouchers for clothing)
- Search Community Mental Health Service – case workers and clients make a social outing to visit the Economy Shop



Between 15 and 20 families are supported through these agencies monthly. The Economy Shop also donates \$100 monthly to the Salvation Army food bank.

We also give all the unsaleable metals to Scouts Canada; they have a trailer parked at our location, and a volunteer takes the metal apart and places it in bins on their trailer. They keep the money for programs they run.

Saint Vincent de Paul Summer Camp – children are sponsored by us to attend the SSVP summer camp (we fully support up to 25 children and pay fees for kids to go to camp). This is also a partnership with C.A.S as they have referrals for children who would benefit being at camp.

We currently employ 7 full time and part time staff and are blessed to have reliable volunteers who are also very invested. The store is open Monday thru Saturday, 9:30am to 5pm.
