Please mark your calendars and join us for our Spring General Members Meeting in St. Catharines!




St. Michael's Dunnville Celebrates 170 Years of SSVP

By now, all Conferences should have their annual report completed and should have passed their report onto their Particular Council. This stage is always to be done by January 31st. If you have not completed your report yet, please do so as soon as possible.

Particular Councils need to submit their report to the next higher council no later than February 28th. Please remember to include all your special works programs and to consolidate all the information your conferences have reported to you.

Central Councils, your report is due to ONRC no later than March 20th. Again, please include all your special works programs and consolidate all the information your Conferences/Particular Council have reported to you.

Annual Reports Now Due

All Councils must list exactly which Conferences are included in their report and include a list of those who have not reported. Not only is this important for us to know should a conference send their report directly to us (as we would not want their information counted twice), but this information is asked for on Form C-D. While we have improved over the years, we still have some Councils who do not complete Form C-D. We ask that you complete each section of the annual report as fully and accurately as possible.

Regional Council reports are due on March 31st. That means ONRC has a mere 11 days to complete our report; this year we will be particularly tight on time as our Spring Meeting in St. Catharines is on March 31-April 1st – the same time that our report is due to National. Therefore, this year especially, we ask that you submit your reports on time. Your annual report is important and the higher councils rely on your information.

ONRC will prepare a summary from all reports to be distributed to all presidents by the end of May.
