Lac- Megantic

The tragedy in Lac Megantic put a hole in the center of the town and through the hearts of so many people. So many people hurt by this tragedy is almost un-imaginable. It was also unimaginable that we not respond. As Vincentians and Christians we show people that we care, by our actions and not just words and prayers. We showed them that our thoughts and prayers were with them in this time of sorrow by bringing gifts of goods and money. However, our most important reason for coming was to tell them that we share their grief.

Speaking at the masses on the weekend in Saint John of The Cross Parish in Mississauga brought out this response:

Donations of \$2,400.00, bedding, clothing, water, food and supplies 720 of our parishioners signed a 8.5 X 14" sympathy card

The Peterborough Vincentians lent us a 14' truck, serviced and filled with gas for the week. All clothes and food were checked for cleanliness, damage and stale date.

Eight hundred kilometers later in Lac-Megantic we were met by Louise Larivière who acted as interpreter. The truck was unloaded by off-duty fireman, the same individuals that fought the horrific inferno.

Father Lemay took us to the church. He was tired and surprised that so many people were aware of their tragedy and cared. And he assured us that the sympathy card would be read at each of the Sunday masses. There were memorial boards around the church for each lost person.

New SSVP Store in Goderich dedicated to furniture and major appliances, located at 417 Parsons Court

On 2 July 2013, the Goderich community welcomed a second SSVP store! Located at 417 Parsons Court, this store is dedicated to the resale of gently used furniture and major appliances.

The previous store, on MacEwan, is still open, and is now able to focus on clothing and other smaller treasures leaving the bigger items to the new (and bigger) store. Smaller stores often cannot accept a lot of furniture donations simply because of space limitations. However, with 8,000 square feet, the Parsons store is able to display furniture in room like settings (much like other furni-

ture stores) in a more spacious and attractive way.

The Parsons store is able to deliver purchases within Goderich for \$10, and between \$20-30 for the outlying areas. Of course, they are always looking for volunteers to help with these deliveries. If you would like to help out, or for more information, please call 519-612-1387.
