Newcomers have been welcomed into a number of communities in Ontario. A number of Syrian families have settled in London with increased calls coming to Conferences with requests for furniture, clothing and household items. The language barrier was a challenge when the calls first started. After making a home visit, a voucher

would have a long list of furniture and household items needed to be filled by the store. After having a settlement counselor attend and speak at a London Particular Council meeting, our members learned to ask our families who call "What do you need" vs. "What do you want". If something is offered to them, they will say "yes" as it is rude in their culture not to accept something that is being offered. Our members now ensure a translator is present when the home visit is made to determine their needs, as well as having a translator attend with them at the store to select their clothing needs. Having the settlement counselor speak at a Council meeting was very informative and has helped London SSVP to better serve the needs of our newcomer families.

I hope to see many of you at the upcoming ONRC meeting in London September 16 / 17, and hope to have a chance to personally meet you if we have not already met.
